Abstract

This is a perl task that creates XMM RGS data products not made by **rgsproc**.

3 Description

There are two ways to make XMM products for the RGS cameras: via the XMM data pipeline or via the SAS task **rgsproc**. The latter does not however produce the full set of product files: the images (both FITS and PNG) are not produced, nor are the PDF spectrum plots. It is the function of **rgsprods** to supply this lack - ie, the sum of the RGS pipeline functionality is intended to be duplicated by **rgsproc** followed by **rgsprods**.

rgsprods should be run from the directory in which the products are stored.

The task can't find an RGS event list with the correct XMM-product name format in the PWD.

noGifBananaImage (error)

The task is ready to convert the beta-PI (sometimes known as the banana plot) GIF image into PNG form, but the GIF image cannot be found. Note that if harsh='no', a warning rather than an error results.

rgsspecplotFailed (error)

The task attempted to invoke **rgsspecplot** but could not. Note that if harsh='no', a warning rather than an error results.

pstopdfFailed (error)

The task attempted to invoke the utility 'ps2pdf' but could not. Note that if harsh='no', a warning rather than an error results.

6 XMM product format

XMM products adhere to a standard naming scheme (see [1]) which may be summarised by the following template:

Pooooooooiiteeennnnndddd.xxx

The fields have the following meanings:

- ooooooooo: 10-digit observation ID.
- ii: instrument identifier (eg R1, R2).
- t: exposure type (usually either 'S' or 'U', for 'scheduled' or 'unscheduled').
- eee: 3-digit exposure ID.
- nnnnn: 6-character product type identifier.
- dddd: 4-digit utility number.
- xxx: file data type identifier. Examples are 'FIT', 'GIF', 'PNG', 'PDF'.

7 Input Files

- 1. Calibrated RGS event list; nnnnnndddd.xxx = 'EVENLI0000.FIT'.
- 2. RGS source list dataset, with associated region extensions; nnnnnndddd.xxx = 'SRCLI_0000.FIT'.
- 3. RGS spectra; nnnnnndddd.xxx = 'SRSPECdddd.FIT'. The first digit of 'dddd' should be the spectral order number and the last three digits the row number of the source in the RGS source list.

8 Output Files

Products as follows:

- 1. FITS version of the detector-plane image. nnnnnndddd.xxx = 'IMAGE_0000.FIT'.
- 2. PNG version of the detector-plane image. nnnnnndddd.xxx = 'IMAGE_0000.PNG'.
- 3. FITS version of the beta-PI ('banana') image. nnnnnndddd.xxx = 'ORDIMG0000.FIT'.
- 4. PNG version of the beta-PI ('banana') image. nnnnnndddd.xxx = 'ORDIMG0000.PNG'.
- 5. For each source for which there is a spectrum (see section 7), a PDF spectrum plot of all orders. nnnnnndddd.xxx = 'SRSPEC0ddd.PDF' where the 3 digits ddd are the same as the corresponding digits of the input spectrum files.



9 Algorithm

giftopnm detplane_gif | pnmtopng > detplane.PNG

   run rgsspecplot with list of fits spectra as input, to make PDF spectrum plot
} end foreach source
```
