3 Description

ds9tocxc converts a given Ds9 region file to *CXC*[1] format. The Ds9 regions are read from standard input and the name of the CXC set is given via parameters **outset**. The names of the coordinates axes in the CXC file can be specified via parameters **xcolumn** and **ycolumn**. Example:

```
ds9tocxc outset=reg.cxc xcolumn=DETX ycolumn=DETY <reg.ds9
```

Y-coordinates of region reference points will be stored in column with this name in the output data set.

InvalidRegion (*error*)

A Ds9 region was encountered that cannot be mapped onto an equivalent CXC region.
